

## Young European Peers

The Young European Peers are busy with different programs, for example called "Erasmus +".

These are programs for pupils, students and trainees with the aim of education, sport and youth work.

*Erasmus +* for example get 15 billion euro per year from the EU, so the youth can visit further trainings or do an internship abroad.

These programs are very helpful for example for students, who have to wait for their semester. They don't need experience; they can make a teaching period abroad for example at a vocational school or in a company. This will modernize the development and the new implementation. Moreover *Erasmus +* promote the mobility of students.

The program integrate 4000 institutions in 33 countries. Since 1987 3 million students have already been participated in the program.

In addition, these are also advantages:

- no university fees
- monthly scholarship
- recognition and support of the student's work ("learning agreement")
- language course

The next program is called the "European voluntary service."

The charitable action "Youth in Action" was founded in 1996 and deals with issues such as youth, environment, culture, etc. When you want to participate you have to be between 18 and 30 years old.

After the voluntary service you'll get the "Youthpass" as a certificate.

In addition these are also advantages:

- 90% of the travel expenses will be reimbursed

- you'll get a pocket money
- free accommodation and meals
- language course
- use of public transport
- insurance and support

At last the YEPs told us something about the "euro pass."

The euro pass is like a curriculum vitae, but with much more matter, for example the comparing of your skills, your language pass or your mobility.

This could be an advantage, when you're applying a company.
